### DOINGS during COVID

I am so proud of all I hear that Templars have been doing during these uncertain times. Like the Templars of old, we have been protecting those who cannot/will not protect themselves; raising monies; cooking and delivering food; visiting the lonely whether on-line or by phone – and making sure that no one is forgotten.

And we have all had our own projects to keep away the sense o futility at not being able to truly reach out a helping hand and hold another in our own.

One of the things I have being doing is working on the requirements for the Templar Pilgrim's Medal, and here they are:

You will be expected to have visited at least ten Templar sites: including at least three in the Holy Lands (actually, if you go to Israel, all ten sites can be done very readily).

At each site you will be expected to meditate on the meaning and the connection with our Order and make notes/take pictures to communicate the experience when you return.

Visiting ten sites can be done in one visit or over any number of years.

Your experience must be shared: whether in a presentation to your Priory, or in an article posted on our website or included with a Newsletter.

An application attesting to these requirements and co-signed by your Prior must be submitted to the Grand Prior.

The design for the medal is being worked on . . . it looks like it will be a Canadian Logo with a pilgrim's staff on the reverse and on the obverse, a Pilgrim. More on that once they are ready to go!

# THE INTERNATIONAL SCENE

Committee work continues internationally although physical meetings are not taking place.

ZOOM meetings are now the norm and many priories, both at home, and internationally are strengthening their ties through these meetings.

The Security Committee continues to train members for local and international meetings and the Venues Committee remains active planning for future meetings: including Canada for 2022.

## SHARING INTERNATIONAL CONCERNS & REQUESTS FOR ACTION

The **HAGGIA SOPHIA** is an incredibly important Christian Site: it is the Eastern Orthodox' equivalent of St Peter's Basilica at the Vatican or the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. I visited the Haggia Sophia ("Holy Wisdom") in 2005 and that evening I recorded in my diary:

"I found this site strangely unsettling. Bad enough that the Templars had desecrated it during their battles on behalf of the Pope vs. the Patriarch, but to see the garishly large hieroglyphics (70 metres - the larges in the world) and the defaced faces of saints & angels is disconcerting. I felt personally violated in that place. Strange ... I had never expected any such response."

Yet, I also felt awe at its very presence, despite the fact that it had been turned into a mosque and then a museum. It was utterly overwhelming. I felt it had been desecrated

by no longer being a place of Christian worship but appreciated the fact that at least we could stand in the presence of this amazing structure, raised to the glory of God.

BUT, the President of Turkey in July turned it over to Muslim authorities to be used as a mosque once more. All Christians should be appalled by a supposedly secular state acting in such a manner to a site designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. All Christians are urged take this matter to heart, to pray and to make all aware of this desecration. Write letters, lobby, do whatever you can do.



The World Council of Churches (of which we are a member) has also expressed its "fervent hope and prayer that Hagia Sophia will not become once again a focus of confrontation and conflict, but will be restored to the emblematic unifying role that it has served since 1934".

The Grand Prior of the USA has issued directives that there will be NO Investitures during the COVID outbreak. If you are accustomed to attending American events, it is unlikely that any such events will be taking place for the foreseeable future.



Bishop Angaelos, the General Bishop of the Coptic Church in the UK warned that Christians are facing genocide in the Middle East aftr two churches in Egypt were bombed by I.S. and 45 Christians died.



In light of all that is going on in the Holy Land, all Templars are requested to join in this prayer in words drawn from the OSMTH Prayer for Peace:

"Almighty God, the Creator of all, we remind ourselves daily ... that the psalmist of old bids us to pray for the peace and prosperity of Jerusalem and of all peoples." "Help us to see all people as members of the great family of humanity, under God, in a fellowship of peace; with love one for another in the dignity of the human form you have created. AMEN, AMEN and AMEN"

### AND IN CONCLUSION . . .

This is my final Newsletter as your Grand Prior, and as I entrust our Order to the loving care and administration of Sir George, I want to share with you my vision for the future of our Order, slightly modified from my homily at the Investiture of our newest Priory in Edmonton:



REMARKS on the FUTURE of the ORDER H.E. the Reverend Dame Nola Crewe Grand Prior - Canada - OSMTH the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 2020



Look about you . . . such a building as this is called a church. But the four walls and roof, no matter how beautiful or how historic or how lovingly constructed is just a shell in which we gather. It is the people who are the Church. God's people are the Church.

Similarly, our Order is no more, and no less, than the individuals who enter into it and supports its goals and causes.

The Oath we take is the formal commitment made first on the day of our entry into the Order. But if your heart and soul does not embrace the objectives - which quite simply can be reduced to ensuring that the world is a better, more loving and peaceful place for your having passed this way - it is pointless to say the words. Taking the Oath commits you to observing ever the Commandment of Jesus that you love your God and your neighbour as yourself.

To that end, there are many ways and places to serve: locally, nationally, internationally.

There are sick to be visited; hungry to be fed; Christians at risk; children to be educated; things to learn and thing to be taught; the aged; the refugee . . . whatever the talents God has given you: as a Templar, employ them in His service. And so, I challenge you to examine your skills, your talents, your interests and then find a good fit for your abilities. Because when you do, service becomes a passion and the Order, a joy in your life.

Never underestimate your ability to influence the world about you. Both for good . . . and for bad.

Each day we touch the lives of others and that gives you the opportunity to impact others. BUT you must act. Dreaming about great deeds and doing them are two different things. And each great deed starts with a simple resolution to make change.

The health and growth of our Order is in your hands. What you do and how you act and the good that you do is how our Order will be judged.

Your Priory's growth and the success in the projects you undertake are entirely in your hands.

You are Templars. You have answered the call. You have accepted the challenge. You have endless opportunities to do good before you. You are my brothers and my sisters. And I am yours.

I commend this Priory of the Holy Trinity to your care and keeping . . . with you may it thrive and bless our lands, our faith and our world. And my God, the Holy Trinity, bless you all. So may it be. AMEN
