

TYNDALL, a post village in Selkirk co., Man., on the C.P.R., 8 miles east of Selkirk. It has a telegraph office. Pop., 200.

TYNEHEAD, a post settlement in New Westminster dist., B.C., 15 miles from New Westminster, on the C.P.R.

TYNEMOUTH RIVER, a river of St. John co., N.B.

TYNESIDE, a post office in Wentworth co., Ont., 2 miles from Glanford, a station on the Port Dover & Hamilton div. of the G.T.R., 5 miles north of Caledonia.

TYNE VALLEY, a post settlement in Prince co., P.E.I., 2 miles from Port Hill, on the P.E.I. Ry.

TYTOWN, a post office in Glengarry co., Ont., 4 1-2 miles from Cornwall, on the G. T. R. and N. Y. & O. Ry., 67 miles west of Elgin Montreal.

TYRCONNEL, a post settlement in Elgin co., Ont., 6 miles from Dutton, on the M.C.P. and Pere Marquette Ry. It has 1 store and 1 saw mill. Pop. 140.

TYRONE, a post settlement in Queens co., P.E.I., 10 miles from Charlottetown on the P.E.I. Ry.

TYRONE, a post settlement in Durham co., Ont., 7 miles from Bowmanville, on the G.T.R. It has 4 stores, 2 saw mills and 1 flour mill. Pop. 400.

TYRELL, a post hamlet in Norfolk co., Ont., 1 1-4 miles from Renton, a station on the Jarvis and Port Rowan div. of the G.T.R., 7 miles from Simcoe, also 7 miles from Port Dover. It has 2 churches (Methodist and Baptist), jeweller and blacksmith shops. Pop. 12.

TYRELL'S LAKE, a station on the Alberta Ry., 34 miles from Lethbridge.

TYVAN, a post settlement in Qu'Appelle dist. Sask., 49 miles from Regina, on the Brandon and Regina branch of the C.P.R.

TZOUHALEM, a post settlement in Nanaimo dist., B.C., 3 miles from Duncan's Station, on the Esquimalt & Nanaimo Ry.

UKANATSI or **WAKONICHI** ("The Lake of Crooked Mountains"), a lake of Quebec, near Lake Mistassini. Length about 30 miles, breadth 9 miles; area, 28,000 acres. It is very deep and abounds with fish.

UCLUELET, a post settlement in Comox, Atlin dist., B.C., 11 miles from Victoria, on the Esquimalt & Nanaimo and Victoria & Sidney railways.

UDNEY, a post settlement in Ontario co., Ont., and a station on the Can. Northern Ont. Ry., 77 miles north-east of Toronto. It has 1 saw mill. Pop. 40.

UDORA, a post village in Ontario co., Ont., on Black River, 7 miles from Sunderland, on the G.T.R., 12 miles north of Blackwater and 12 miles south of Lorneville. It has 1 Methodist church, 1 store, 2 hotels, 1 branch bank, sash and door, 1 grist and 3 saw mills and 2 pump factories. Pop. 200.

UFFINGTON, a post village in Muskoka electoral dist., Ontario co., Ont., 11 miles south-east of Bracebridge Station, on the G.T.R. It has 3 churches (Epis., Meth. and Pres.), 2 stores 1 hotel, 1 grist mill and 1 saw mill. Pop. 127.

UFF LAKE, a lake of Ontario, in the Muskoka district, on which is the village of Ufford. It affords good fishing.

UFFORD, a post village in Muskoka dist., Ont., on Three Mile Lake, 7 miles from Utterson, on G.T.R. (Tor. & North Bay div.), 14 miles north of Bracebridge. It contains 2 churches, 1 saw and shingle mill and 1 store. It is in the finest agricultural part of Muskoka and is noted for the beauty of its surrounding scenery, being the resort in summer time of a large number of Toronto people and others. A short distance from here is Skeleton Lake, on the shore of which is the exact representation in the solid rock of part of a human skeleton. The lake is also noted for its bold romantic scenery, its clear water and its salmon fishing. Pop. 300.

UHTHOFF, a post village in Simcoe co., Ont., on the Midland div. of the G.T.R., 8 miles north-west of Orillia. Pop., 95.

UIGG, a station on the Murray Harbor branch of the P.E. Island R.R., in Queens co. E., P.E.I., 20 miles east of Charlottetown and 27 miles north-west of Murray Harbor.

ULLSWATER, a post village in Muskoka dist., situate north-west of Raymond, between Skeleton Lake and Three Mile Lake, 11 miles from Utterson Station, on the G.T.R. (North Bay branch), 10 miles south of Huntsville. It has 1 Episcopal church and 1 saw mill. Pop. 117.

ULRIC, a post office in Mackenzie dist., Prov. of Saskatchewan, 23 miles from Canora, on the Can. Nor. Ry.

ULSTER, Bruce co., Ont. See Whitechurch, on the Kincardine branch of the G.T.R., 6 miles from Winham.

ULTICANS, a settlement in Restigouche co., N.B., 2 miles from Jacquet River, on the I.C.R.

ULVERTON, a post settlement in Drummond co., Ont., 5 miles from Lisgar, on the G.T.R. It contains 3 churches, 3 stores, 1 hotel, saw, grist and woollen mills, 1 butter factory and 1 tannery. Pop. 300.

UMATILLA, a small post settlement in Marquette co., Man., 7 miles from Grand View, a station on the Gilbert Plains branch of the Canadian Northern R.R. It has 2 churches (Presbyterian and Methodist). Pop., about 75.

UMFRAVILLE, a post village in Hastings co., Ont., 7 miles from Ormsby, on the Central Ontario Ry. Pop. 30.

UNDERHILL, a post village in Souris co., Man., a station on the Can. Northern R.R., 7 miles west of Elgin. It has 1 Methodist church, 1 general store and 3 grain elevators, together with express and telegraph offices. Pop., about 150.

UNDERHILL, a post village in Northumberland co., N.B., on the South West Miramichi River, 2 miles from Blackville and on the Fredericton branch of the I.C.R. It contains 2 churches (Episcopal and Baptist), and 3 stores. Pop., about 300.

UNDERWOOD, a post village in Bruce co., Ont., 10 miles from Port Elgin, on the G.T.R. Southampton branch), 12 miles north-west of Paisley. It contains 2 churches (Presbyterian and Methodist), 4 stores, 2 hotels, 1 saw mill, 1 butter and cheese factory and telegraph office. Pop. 150.

UNDINE, a post village in Victoria co., N.B., on the east side of the St. John River, 8 miles from Grand Falls, on the C.P.R. It contains 1 Presbyterian church. Pop., about 300.

UNEDA, a post settlement in Lanark co., Ont., 12 miles from Pakenham, on the main line of the C.P.R., 8 miles from Arnprior, and 9 miles from Almonte.

UNGAVA DISTRICT (area, 354,961 square miles), with an estimated population, in 1901, of 5,113, was created by an Order of the Privy Council of Canada, Oct. 2, 1895. It embraces the whole region of country to the north of the height of land in the Province of Quebec, or, more specifically, from the line of the East Main and the Hamilton Rivers, extending from James Bay to the Labrador Coast on the Atlantic, northward to Hudson Strait and Ungava Bay, with the exception of a strip on the east or Atlantic Coast, belonging to Labrador, a dependency of Newfoundland. Its western limits are Hudson Bay and its spacious inlet of James' Bay. The affairs of the district are under the direction of the Lieut.-Governor of the North-West Territories and his executive council at Regina. The Ungava district of the North East Territories of the Dominion, or, as it is sometimes called, the Labrador Peninsula of Northern Quebec, is well watered by lakes and rivers, though its settlements are few and widely scattered. It contains much woodland wealth in its vast forests of spruce trees, most valuable for pulp-wood purposes.

UNIACKE MINES, a small settlement in Hants co., N.S., on the Meander River, 4 miles from Mount Uniacke, a station on the Dominion Atlantic R.R., 13 miles from Windsor Jct., and 19 miles from Windsor, also 27 miles from Halifax. It has 1 Union church and 2 ore crushing mills. Pop. 35.

UNIATCHOUAN, and the UNIATCHOUANISH, two rivers of Quebec, running into Lake St. John, are navigable for large bateaux for many leagues and farther up for bark canoes.

UNION, a village in Colchester co., N.S., on the Salmon River, and a station on the I.C.R. (Pictou branch), 9 miles from Truro. Pop., 50.

UNION, a post settlement in Elgin co., Ont., with a station called Whites, on the London & Port Stanley branch of the Pere Marquette Ry. It has 2 stores, 1 hotel, 2 saw mills, 1 flour mill, 1 carriage factory, 1 cider mill and 1 branch bank (Sterling). Pop. 300.

UNION AV., a station on the C.P.R. (Rossland branch), in Kootenay dist., B.C., 2 miles from Rossland.

UNION BAY, a post settlement in Comox-Atlin dist., B.C. Nanaimo, on the Esquimalt & Nanaimo Ry. is the nearest station.

UNION CENTRE, a post settlement in Pictou co., N.S., 4 miles from Westville, on the Pictou branch of the I.C.R.

UNION CORNER, a post village on Northumberland Strait, in Prince co., P.E.I., 12 miles from Summerside. The nearest station (5 miles distant) is Wellington, on the P. E. Island R.R., 6 miles from Miscouche. Farming and lobster fishing are the chief industries. It has 1 Methodist church and 1 lobster canning factory. Pop. 93.

UNION CORNER, a post village near the Maine border, in Carleton co., N.B., 3 miles from Green Road Station, on the Debec Jct. branch of the C.P.R., 5 miles from Houlton, Me., and 14 from Woodstock. It contains 1 Baptist church. Pop. 120.

UNION HALL, a post settlement in Lanark co., Ont., 8 miles from Almonte, on the C.P.R.

UNION MILLS, a settlement in Colchester co., N.S., 1 mile from Union, on the I.C.R.

UNION NORTH, a settlement in Queens co., P.E.I., 6 miles from York, a station on the P.E.I. Ry.

UNION POINT, a post office in Provencher co., Man., and a station on the Canadian Northern R.R. (Emerson div.), 13 miles north of Morris, and 28 miles south of Winnipeg.

UNION ROAD, a post settlement in Queens co., P.E.I., and a station on the Souris branch of the P.E.I. Ry., 7 miles from Charlottetown.

UNION SQUARE, a post village in Lunenburg co., N.S., $\frac{9}{10}$ miles from Waterville Ry. station, on the Dom. Atlantic R.R. Pop. 100.

UNIONVILLE, a post village in York co., Ont., on the River Rouge, and on the G.T.R., 3 miles from Markham, and 20 miles from Toronto. It contains 4 churches (Episcopal, Presbyterian, Methodist and Lutheran), 1 grist mill, 1 saw mill, 4 stores, 1 hotel, 1 bank (Sovereign), and express and telegraph offices. Pop. 367.

UNO PARK, a post office in Dymond township, Nipissing dist., North Ont., and a station on the continuation of the Temiskaming & Northern Ontario R.R., north-west of New Liskeard post office and station, on Lake Temiskamingue.

UPBIKUBATCH (or UPIKAUBA) RIVER, of Que., rises in a lake of the same name in Montmorency co., and flows into Lake St. John, forming a large bay surrounded by rocky mountains. It descends from a succession of rapids.

UPHAM, a post village in Kings co., N.B., on the Hammond River, and a station on the Hampton & St. Martin's Railway of New Brunswick. It contains 2 churches (Episcopal and Roman Catholic), 4 stores, 1 grist and 2 saw mills and 1 cheese factory, besides express and telephone offices. Pop., 100.

UPHILL, a post village in Victoria co., Ont., on Head River, 11 miles from Victoria Road Station, on the Cobocok & Lindsay branch of the G.T.R., 9 miles south of Cobocok. It has 2 stores and a public school with telegraph and express offices at station. Pop. 50.

UPLANDS, a post office in Parry Sound dist., Ont. (Machar township), 4 miles from South River Station, on the Toronto and North Bay div. of the G.T.R., 18 miles north of Burk's Falls and 31 miles south of Callander. It is in a good agricultural region, where free grant lands are still obtainable.

UPPER, a post settlement in Haldimand co., Ont., 9 miles from Cayuga, on the St. Thomas branch of the G.T.R., and on the Michigan Central Ry.

UPPER ABOUGOGGIN, a post village in Westmoreland co., N.R., 12 miles from Shediac, on the I.C.R. (Point du Chene branch). It contains 1 Roman Catholic church, 1 store, and saw, grist and shingle mills. Pop., under 100.

UPPER ALLUMETTE LAKE, an expansion of the Ottawa River, in Renfrew co., Ont., lying to the north of Pembroke.

UPPER AMHERST COVE, a settlement in the dist. of Bonavista, Nfld. Pop. (1901), 143.

UPPER AMHERST COVE, a settlement in the dist. of Harbor Main, Nfld. Pop. (1901), 76.

UPPER BADDOCK RIVER, a post settlement in Victoria co., N.B.

UPPER BALMORAL, a post settlement in Restigouche co., N.B., 9 miles from Eel River, on the I.C.R.

UPPER BASS RIVER, a post settlement in Colchester co., N.S., 14 miles from Londonderry, on the I.C.R.

UPPER BAY DU VIN, a post settlement in Northumberland co., N.B., 16 miles from Chatham, on the I.C.R.

UPPER BEDFORD, a post office in Missisquoi co., Que., forming part of the town of Bedford.

UPPER BIG TRACADIE, a post village in Guysboro co., N.S., on the Guysboro River, 5 miles from Tracadie Station, on the I.C.R., 18 miles west of Mulgrave, on the Gut of Canso. It has 2 churches (Roman Catholic, and Baptist), 5 stores, 2 lumber and grist mills, besides telegraph and express offices. Pop. 230.

UPPER BLACKVILLE, a post village in Northumberland co., N.B., on the South West Miramichi River and a station on the Fredericton branch of the I.C.R., 38 miles south-west of Chatham. It contains 2 churches (Baptist and Roman Catholic), 2 stores and 1 hotel. Pop., 400.

UPPER BLOOMFIELD, a settlement in Carleton co., N.B., 16 miles from Woodstock, on the I.C.R.

UPPER BONNINGTON, a station on the Nelson & Rossland branch of the C.P.R., in Kootenay dist., B.C., 9 miles from Nelson, and 45 miles from Rossland.

UPPER BRANCH, a post village in Lunenburg co., N.S., on Lahave River, 5 miles from Riversdale, a station on the Halifax & South Western Ry. It has 2 stores, 1 public school and 2 saw mills. It receives its mail via Bridgewater twice a week. Pop., about 600.

UPPER BREWER'S MILLS, a village in Frontenac co., Ont., on the Rideau Canal, 18 miles from Kingston. The nearer station is Ballantyne, on the G.T.R. See Brewer's Mills.

UPPER BRIGHTON, a post village in Carleton co., N.B., on the St. John River, 2 miles from Hartland, a station on the C.P.R., 12 miles from Woodstock. It has 2 churches (United Baptist and Primitive Baptist), saw, grist and carding mills. Farming is the chief industry of the region. Pop., about 175.

UPPER BROOKSIDE, a small post village in a farming region in Colchester co., N.S., 3 miles from Truro, on the I.C.R. and Midland branch of the Dominion Atlantic Ry. It has 1 Baptist church and grist and carding mills. Pop. under 75.

UPPER BUCTOUCHE, a post settlement in Kent co., N.B., 5 miles from St. Anthony, on the Moncton & Buctouche Ry.

UPPER (or WEST) BURGE, a fishing settlement in Burgeo and La Poile dist., Nfld., 3 miles from Lower Burgeo, (Burgeo Proper). Pop. (1901), 52.

UPPER BURLINGTON, a post settlement in Hants co., N.S., 3 miles from Scotch Village, on the Midland division of the Dominion Atlantic Ry.

UPPER BURTON, a post settlement in Sunbury co., N.B. Waasis, on the Fredericton branch of the C.P.R., is the nearest railway station.

UPPER CALEDONIA, a settlement in Guysboro co., N.S., 26 miles from Hopewell, on the I.C.R.

UPPER CANARD, a post village in Kings co., N.S., on the Canard River, 1 mile from Sheffield Mills Station, on the Dom. Atlantic RR. It has 2 churches (Presbyterian and Baptist). Pop., under 150.

UPPER CAPE, a post settlement in Westmoreland co., N.B., 20 miles from Aulac, on the I.C.R., and 2 miles from Melrose, on the New Brunswick & Prince Edward Island Ry. It contains 2 churches (Methodist and Baptist), 1 school, 1 public hall, and several saw mills, 3 shingle mills, 1 wood working factory. Pop., 300.

UPPER CARAQUET, a post settlement in Gloucester co., N.B., and a station on the Caraquez Ry., 45 miles from Bathurst, on the I.C.R.

UPPER CAVERHILL, a post settlement in York co., N.B., 8 miles from Millville, on the Woodstock branch of the C.P.R.

UPPER CHARLO, a post settlement in Restigouche co., N.B., 2½ miles from Charlo Station, on the I.C.R.

UPPER CHELSEA, a small post village in Lunenburg co., N.S., 20 miles from Bridgewater, on the Halifax & South Western Ry., also reached by the Coastal Steam Packet Co.'s line twice a week from Halifax. It has 1 church, 3 stores, 1 hotel and 2 lumber and shingle mills. Pop., 100.

UPPER CLEMENTS, a post settlement in Annapolis co., N.S., a station on the Dominion Atlantic Ry., 3 miles from Clementsport, and 4 miles from Annapolis. It has 2 churches (Meth. and Baptist). Pop., about 100.

UPPER CLYDE RIVER, a post settlement on the Clyde River in Shelburne co., N.S., 14 miles from Shelburne, on the Halifax & South Western Ry. The inhabitants are chiefly engaged in lumbering. It contains 1 Presbyterian church and 1 saw mill. Pop. 61.

UPPER COAL CREEK, a post village in Queens co., N.B., on Coal Creek, 3¾ miles from Pennlyn, on the New Brunswick Ry. The chief industries are farming, lumbering and coal mining. Pop. 40.

UPPER COVERDALE, a post settlement in Albert co., N.B., 4 miles from Salisbury, on the St. John & Moncton branch of the I.C.R., and on the Salisbury & Harvey Ry.

UPPER CROSS CREEK, a station on the Fredericton branch of the I.C.R., in York co., N.B., 31 miles from Fredericton.

UPPER CROSS ROADS. ST. MARY'S, a post village in Guysborough co., N.S., 3 miles from Melrose. It is situated on the East River St. Mary's, 28 miles from Antigonish, a station on the I.C.R. It has 2 churches (Presbyterian and Baptist), 1 general store and 1 hotel.

UPPER DERBY, a post settlement in Northumberland co., N.B., on the Southwest Miramichi river, 3 miles from Indiantown on the Indiantown branch of the I.C.R. It contains a Methodist church, 1 store and 1 hotel. Pop. 60.

UPPER DORCHESTER, a post settlement in Westmoreland co., N.B., and a station on the I.C.R., 3 miles from Dorchester, and 23 miles from Moncton.

UPPER DOVER, a post village in Westmoreland co., N.B., on the Petitcodiac River, 8 miles from Moncton, on the I.C.R. It contains 2 churches (Methodist and Baptist). Pop., about 100.

UPPER DURHAM, a settlement in York

co., N.B., 3 miles east of Nashwaak River, and about the same distance from Durham Station, on the I.C.R., 15 miles from Fredericton, Pop., about 100.

UPPER DYKE VILLAGE, a post village in Kings co., N.S., 2 miles from Sheffield Mills on the Cornwallis Valley branch of the Dominion Atlantic Ry. Pop. 60.

UPPER ECONOMY, a post settlement in Colchester co., N.S., 17½ miles from Londonderry, on the I.C.R.

UPPER FALMOUTH, a small settlement in Hants co., N.S., on the Avon River, 4 1-2 miles from Falmouth, a station on the Dom. Atlantic RR. It has 2 churches (Episcopal and Baptist), 3 stores, 2 lumber mills, 1 barrel factory, with express and telegraph offices at Windsor. Pop. under 100.

UPPER FORT LAWRENCE, a post settlement in Cumberland co., N.S., 2½ miles from Fort Lawrence, on the I.C.R.

UPPER GAGETOWN, a post settlement in Queens co., N.B., and a port of call of the Starr Steamship Co.'s line, 24 miles southeast of Fredericton.

UPPER GASPAREUX, a post settlement in Queens co., N.B. Chipman, on the New Brunswick Ry., is the nearest station.

UPPER GLENCOE, a post settlement in Inverness co., N.S., 10 miles from Glencoe, on the Inverness Ry.

UPPER GLEN ROAD, a post settlement in Antigonish co., N.S., 10 miles from Antigonish, on the I.C.R.

UPPER GOSHEN, a post village in Albert co., N.B., on the Kennebecasis River, 4 miles from Elgin, on the Elgin & Havelock RR. It contains 1 Baptist church and 1 express office. Pop. 150.

UPPER GOULD'S ROAD, a settlement in the dist. of Port-de-Grave, Nfld., 3 miles from Brigus. Pop. (1901), 139.

UPPER GRAND MIRA, a post settlement in Cape Breton co., N.S., 30 miles from Sydney, on the I.C.R. and Sydney & Louisburg Ry.

UPPER GRANVILLE, a post hamlet in Annapolis co., N.S., on Annapolis River, and a station (Granville), on the Dominion Atlantic RR., 10 miles east of Annapolis Royal, and 4 miles west of Bridgetown. It contains a Methodist church and a portable saw mill.

UPPER GREENWICH, a post settlement in Kings co., N.B., 6 miles from Westfield, on the C.P.R. (short line).

UPPER GULLIES, a fishing settlement on the south shore of Conception Bay, in Harbor Main dist., Nfld., and a station on the Reid Nfd. RR., 22 miles from St. John's. It contains 1 Episcopal church, 2 schools, 50 stores, 4 hotels and 5 lobster canning factories. Pop. 300.

UPPER HAMPSTEAD, a post village in Queens co., N.B., on the west side of the River St. John, 25 miles from Welsford, on the C.P.R., 24 miles from St. John, on the St. John and Vanceboro section. It contains 1 Free Baptist church and 1 steam saw mill. Pop. 40.

UPPER HAYNESVILLE, a post settlement in York co., N.B., on the Mackawick River, 4½ miles from the C.P.R. station of Millville, 41 miles from Fredericton and 24 miles from Woodstock. It has 2 churches (United and Reformed Baptist), 2 stores, 1 hotel, 1 saw and 2 grist mills and 1 cheese factory. Pop., 165.

UPPER ISLAND COVE, a settlement in the dist. of Harbor Grace, Nfld. Pop. (1901), 799.

UPPER KEMPT TOWN, a post settlement in Colchester co., N.S., 8 miles from Riversdale, on the Truro & Sydney branch of the I.C.R.

UPPED KENNETCOOK, a post village in Hants co., N.S., on the River Kennetcook, 10 miles from Shubenacadie. Pop., 80.

UPPER KENSINGTON, a settlement in Jacques Cartier co., Que., 1 mile from St. Henri, on the G.T.R.

UPPER KENT, a post settlement in Carleton co., N.B., 5 miles from Kilburn, on the C.P.R. (Edmundston branch).

UPPER KESWICK, or **SMITH'S CORNER**, a post village in York co., N.B., on the Keswick River, and a station on the C.P.R., 20 miles from Fredericton. It contains 2 churches (Methodist and Episcopal) and 1 store. Pop. 150.

UPPER KESWICK RIDGE, a post settlement in York co., N.B., 3 miles from Zealand, on the C.P.R.

UPPER KINGSBURY, a post settlement in Lunenburg co., N.S., east of Le Have River, 12 miles from Lunenburg, a station, on the Halifax & South Western Ry. It has 3 churches (Presbyterian, Methodist and Lutheran), 3 stores and 1 grist mill. Pop., about 300.

UPPER KINTORE, a post village in Victoria co., N.B., on the Tobique River, 5 miles from Curry's Siding, on the Tobique Valley branch of the C.P.R. It contains 1 Presbyterian church and 1 store. Pop. 105.

UPPER KNOXFORD, a post settlement in Carleton co., N.B., 3 miles from Florenceville on the C.P.R. It contains 1 church. Pop., 200.

UPPER LA HAVE, a post settlement in Lunenburg co., N.S., 4 miles from Bridgewater, on the Halifax & Southwestern Ry.

UPPER LAKEVILLE, a post settlement in Halifax co., N.S., 40 miles from Halifax.

UPPER LOCH LOCMOND, a post settlement in St. John co., N.B., at the head of a beautiful lake of the same name, 13 miles from St. John. It is noted for the beauty of the surrounding scenery and its trout fishing, and is a great place of resort in summer. It has 4 churches (Epls., Pres., Meth. and Baptist), 2 stores, 6 hotels and 1 woollen mill. Pop. 200.

UPPER LEITCHES CREEK, a post settlement in Cape Breton co., N.S., 7 miles from Leitches Creek, on the I.C.R.

UPPER MAGAGUADAVIC, a post village in York co., N.B., 4 miles from Prince William, a station on the C.P.R. (Vanceboro and St. John branch), 20 miles from Vanceboro. It is a good region for game, as well as for fishing in season. It has 2 churches (Episcopal and Presbyterian), 1 store, 1 hotel and 1 saw mill. Lake Magaguadavic is situated nearby. Pop. 117.

UPPER MALAGASH, a post village in Cumberland co., N.S., on Tatamagouche Bay, 3 miles from Malagash, on the Oxford branch of the I.C.R., 41 miles west of Picou. It contains 2 churches (Meth. and Pres.), 3 stores, 1 flour mill, 2 saw mills and 1 cheese factory. Pop., 500.

UPPER MARGAREE, a post settlement in Inverness co., N.S., Strathblorn, on the Inverness Ry., is the nearest station.

UPPER MAUGFPVILLE, a post settlement in Sunbury co., N.B., and a port of call of

the Starr Steamship Co.'s steamers, 9 miles from Fredericton.

UPPER MELBOURNE, a post village in Richmond co., Que., on the west bank of St. Francis River, within a mile south of Richmond, a station on the G.T.R., 7½ miles east of Montreal. It has 2 churches (Presbyterian and Methodist), 3 stores, and 1 butter and cheese factory, with telegraph and express offices at Richmond. Pop., 300.

UPPER MIDDLEBORO, a post settlement in Cumberland co., N.S., 4½ miles from Pugwash Jct., on the I.C.R. (Oxford & Pictou branch).

UPPER MIDDLE RIVER, a post settlement in Victoria co., N.S., 25 miles from Iona, on the Truro & Sydney branch of the I.C.R.

UPPER MILLS, a settlement on the St. Croix River in Charlotte co., N.B., on the Maine border, one-eighth of a mile (across the river boundary) from Baring, Me., with port at St. Stephen, N.B. The villagers find employment, in the main, in the mills at Baring. Upper Mills has 1 Methodist church and 1 general store. Pop., about 100.

UPPER MUSQUODOBOIT, a post settlement in Halifax co., N.S., 25 miles from Shubenacadie, on the I.C.R.

UPPER NAPPAN, a post settlement in Cumberland co., N.S., 3½ miles from Amherst, on the C.P.R.

UPPER NELSON, a post village in Northumberland co., N.B., on the Miramichi River, and a station on the Fredericton branch of the I.C.R., 9 miles from Chatham Jct. It has 3 churches (Roman Catholic, Methodist and Presbyterian) and 3 stores, 3 hotels, 1 grist mill, 1 saw mill and express and telegraph offices. Pop., about 400.

UPPER NEW CORNWALL, a post settlement in Lunenburg co., N.S., 4 miles from Riversdale Station, on the Halifax & Southwestern Ry.

UPPER NEW HARBOUR, a post settlement in Guysboro co., N.S., 40 miles from Mulgrave, on the I.C.R.

UPPER NEW HORTON, a post hamlet in Albert co., N.B., on Shepody Bay 2½ miles from Albert, on the Salisbury & Harvey RR. It has 1 Baptist church. Pop. 55.

UPPER NEWPORT, a post village in Hants co., N.S., on Meander and Hebert Rivers, 4½ miles from Brooklyn station, on the Midland branch of the Dom. Atlantic Ry., 13 miles from Windsor. It has 1 public hall (used chiefly by the Pres. and Baptist bodies for religious worship), 1 general store, 1 lumber mill and 1 blacksmith and wheelwright shop. Pop., 120.

UPPER NINE MILE RIVER, a post settlement in Hants co., N.S., 11 miles from Elmsdale, on the I.C.R.

UPPER-NORTHFIELD, a settlement in Lunenburg co., N.S., 1½ miles from Riversdale, on the Halifax & Southwestern Ry.

UPPER NORTH RIVER, a post village in Colchester co., N.S., on the Upper North River, 10 miles from Truro, on the I.C.R. It contains 1 Presbyterian church, 1 store and 1 saw mill. Pop. 158.

UPPER OHIO, a post hamlet in Shelburne co., N.S., on Roseway River, 13 miles from Shelburne, a station on the Halifax & South Western RR. There is good fishing in the lakes of the vicinity, also good hunting in the region. It has 1 Union church. Pop., 60.

UPPER ONTABOG, a post village in Queens co., N.B., 30 miles from Westfield Beach, a station on the C.P.R., 14 miles north-west of St. John. It contains 2 Baptist churches, 1 store, 1 blacksmith shop and 1 saw mill. Pop. 200.

UPPER PEEL, a post settlement in Carleton co., N.B., 2 miles from Lawrenceville, on the Edmundston branch of the C.P.R.

UPPER PEREAUX, a post village in Kings co., N.S., on Pereaux River, 2½ miles from Canning, on the Dominion Atlantic Ry., Cornwallis Valley branch. It contains 1 Baptist church, 1 store, 2 hotels, 1 barrel factory and 1 grist mill. Pop. 275.

UPPER PINEVALE, a small settlement in Antigonish co., N.S., 10 miles from Antigonish, a station on the I.C.R. Pop., 39.

UPPER POCKMOUCHE, a post settlement in Gloucester co., N.B., 3 miles from Inkerman, on the Gulf Shore Ry.

UPPER POINTE DE BUTE, a post settlement in Westmoreland co., N.B., 4 miles from Au Lac, on the I.C.R.

UPPER PORT LATOUR, a fishing settlement in Shelburne co., N.S., 13 miles from Barrington Passage, on the Halifax & South Western RR. It has 1 Methodist church and 2 stores. Pop. 450.

UPPER PROSPECT, a fishing settlement in Halifax (West) co., N.S., at the entrance to Prospect Bay, and near Prospect post office, 20 miles from Richmond, a station on the I.C.R., 1 mile from Halifax. It has 1 Roman Catholic church, 7 stores and post office. Pop., 250.

UPPER PUGWASH, a post office in Cumberland co., N.S., on the Pugwash River, 4 miles from Pugwash Station, on a branch of the I.C.R., 4 miles from Pugwash Jct., with port at Pugwash Harbor, on Northumberland Strait.

UPPER QUEENSBURY, a post settlement in York co., N.B., 17 miles from Millville, on the Woodstock branch of the C.P.R.

UPPER RAWDON, a post village in Hants co., N.S., 16 miles from Elmsdale, on the I.C.R., 30 miles north-east of Halifax. It contains 2 churches (Methodist and Disciples), 1 store, 1 hotel, saw and grist mills, and 1 carriage factory. Pop., 200.

UPPER REXTON, a settlement in Kent co., N.B., on the Richibucto River, near Northumberland Strait, 2½ miles from Rexton Station, on the Kent Northern RR., with port at Richibucto. It has 1 public hall. Pop., about 250.

UPPER (or NORTHERN STAVE) RIVER B.C. is the main feeder of Stave Lake, and, as far as can be gleaned from Indians, is about 40 miles in length and rises near Pemberton meadows. Its southern portion is an enormous mountain, about 50 yards wide, with sandy reaches amid parklike scenery of alder groves, the home of the little red deer. A flat strip of agricultural land lies on either side, and Indians report the existence of newly discovered grass lands further up its banks, also a fall about 20 miles from the lake. The Upper Stave is best reached by taking canoe at the falls of the Lower Stave, 4½ miles from the Fraser.

UPPER RIVER DENNIS, a post settlement in Inverness co., N.S., 6 miles from River Dennis Station, on the I.C.R.

UPPER ROCKPORT, a post settlement in Westmoreland co., N.B. Sackville, at the junction of the N.B. & P.E.I. Ry. with the I.C.R., is the nearest station.

UPPER ROCKY BROOK, a settlement in the dist. of Trinity, Nfld. Pop. (1901), 54.

UPPER SACKVILLE, a post village in Westmoreland co., N.B., a station (½ a mile distant) on the New Brunswick & Prince Edward Island Ry., 4 miles from Sackville and near Silver Lake. It contains 2 churches (Methodist and Baptist), 1 store, 1 sash and door factory, and 1 butter factory. Pop., about 500.

UPPER SACKVILLE, a post village in Halifax co., N.S., 15 miles from the city of Halifax.

UPPER ST. BASIL, a post settlement in Victoria co., N.B., 5 miles from Edmundston, on the C.P.R.

UPPER ST. FRANCIS, a post office in Victoria co., N.B. See Connors.

UPPER SANDY POINT, a settlement in the dist. of Twillingate, Nfld. Pop. (1901), 21.

UPPER SCOTSBURN, a post settlement in Pictou co., N.S., 4 miles from Scotsburn Station, on the Oxford branch of the I.C.R., 9 miles west of Pictou. It contains a public school and 2 Presbyterian churches.

UPPER SHEFFIELD, a post settlement in Sunbury co., N.B., on the St. John River, 11 miles from Waasis, a station on the Fredericton branch of the C.P.R., 10 miles from Fredericton. Upper Sheffield, with Sheffield Academy, and Sheffield, form one continuous village, 5 miles in length, with a fine farming and fruit-growing country about it. It has 1 Congregational church and express and telegraph offices. Pop. 75.

UPPER SMALL POINT, a fishing settlement in Bay-de-Verde dist., Nfld., on the north shore of Conception Bay, 10½ miles from Carbonear. Pop. (1901), 157.

UPPER SMITHFIELD, a post settlement in Guysborough co., N.S.

UPPER SOUTHAMPTON, a post settlement in York co., N.B., 17 miles from Woodstock, on the C.P.R.

UPPER SOUTH RIVER, a post village in Antigonish co., N.S., on South River, 12 miles from South River Station, on the I.C.R., 5 miles from Antigonish. It contains 1 Presbyterian church, 1 store, 1 grist mill and 1 cheese factory. Pop. 200.

UPPER SOUTH-WEST MABOU, a post settlement in Inverness co. (Cape Breton Island), on the South-West Mabou River, 5 miles from Glencoe, on the Inverness RR. & Coal Co.'s line. Pop. 100.

UPPER SPRINGFIELD, a post village in Antigonish co., N.S., 14 miles from South River, on the I.C.R., 5 miles from Antigonish. It contains 1 Roman Catholic church, 1 store and 1 saw mill. Pop., 75.

UPPER SPRINGFIELD, a post settlement in York co., N.B., 11 miles from Millville, on the Woodstock branch of the C.P.R.

UPPER SQUAMISH, a settlement in Comox-Atlin dist., B.C., on Squamish River, 60 miles from Vancouver. It has steamboat service twice a week with Vancouver. There is good sport, fishing particularly, in the region. It has 3 stores and 1 hotel. The chief industry is logging, coupled with hop culture and fruit growing and ranching. Pop., 50.

UPPER STEWACKE, a post settlement in Colchester co., N.S., 10 miles from Brookfield, on the I.C.R.

UPPER SUMAS, a post village in a farming region in New Westminster dist., B.C., on the Sumas River, 5 miles from Abbotsford Station on the C.P.R. (Mission Jct., & San Francisco div.), 3 miles from Sumas Jct., and 49 miles east of Vancouver. It has 1 general store, 1 butter factory and creamery, with cider mill annexed, 1 telephone office and a public school. Pop., about 10.

UPPER THORNE CENTRE, a post village in Pontiac co., Que., on the north branch of Quyon River, 14 miles from Shawville, on the Waltham branch of the C.P.R., 44 miles north-west of Hull. It contains 2 churches (Lutheran and Methodist), 3 stores, 1 hotel and 1 saw mill. Pop. 60.

UPPERTON, a post village in Kings co., N.B., on the Hammond River, 3 miles from Upham, on the Hampton & St. Martin's RR. It contains 1 Baptist church and 1 store. Pop., about 100.

UPPER (or NORTH) WAKEFIELD, a post settlement in Wright co., Que., on Gatineau River, and a station (North Wakefield) on the Maniwaki branch of the C.P.R., 26 miles from Ottawa. It contains 1 church, several hotels, 1 store and 1 telegraph office. Pop. 502.

UPPER WASHABUCK, a post settlement in Victoria co., N.S. (Cape Breton Island), 9 miles from Iona Station, on the I.C.R., adjoining Grand Narrows, and 8 miles from Baddeck. It has 1 Roman Catholic church, 2 stores and 1 saw mill.

UPPER WESTFIELD, a post settlement in Kings co., N.B. Wakefield, on the C.P.R. (short line), is the nearest station.

UPPER WESTMORELAND, a post settlement in Prince co., P.E.I. Cape Traverse, on the P.E.I. Ry., is the nearest station.

UPPER WESTMORELAND, a settlement in Westmoreland co., N.B., 5 miles from Au Lac, on the I.C.R.

UPPER WHITEHEAD, a post settlement in Guysborough co., N.S., 29 miles from Mulgrave, on the Truro & Sydney branch of the I.C.R.

UPPER WICKLOW, a post settlement in Carleton co., N.B., 3 miles from Bath, on the Edmundston branch of the C.P.R.

UPPER WOOD HARBOR, a post settlement in Shelburne co., N.S., on Wood Harbor, a flag station on the Halifax & Yarmouth RR., 8 miles from Barrington. It has 1 Free Baptist church, 2 stores and 1 school. Pop. 250.

UPPER WOODSTOCK, a post settlement in Carleton co., N.B., and a station on the Edmundston branch of the C.P.R., 1 mile from Woodstock.

UPSALA, a station on the main line of the C.P.R., in Thunder Bay dist., N.W. Ont., 88 miles west of Port Arthur, at the head of Lake Superior.

UPTERGROVE, a post settlement in Ontario co., Ont., and a station on the Midland div. of the G.T.R., 4 miles east of Orillia. It contains 1 store, 3 hotels and a blacksmith shop. Pop. 150.

UPTON, a station on the G.T.R., in Bagot co., Que., 12 miles east of St. Hyacinthe, and 48 miles from Montreal. It has 1 branch bank, See St. Ephram d'Upton.

UPTON, LOT 54, a post and farming settlement in Kings co., P.E.I., on the Grand

River, 5 miles from St. Peters, on the Souris branch of the Prince Edward Island Ry. It contains 1 Union church (Methodist and Presbyterian), school-houses, saw and carding mills.

URBANIA, a post village in Hants co., N.S., on the Shubenacadie River, 7 miles from Green Oaks, a station on the Midland RR. Pop., 160.

URBINVILLE, a post settlement in Prince co., P.E.I., 2 miles from Wellington, on the P.E.I. Ry.

URNEY, a post hamlet in Kings co., N.B., 8 miles from Sussex, a station on the I.C.R., 43 miles north-east of St. John. Pop., 75.

URQUHARTS, a post settlement in Kings co., N.B., 9 miles from Jubilee, on the St. John & Moncton branch of the I.C.R.

URQUHARTS SIDING, a settlement in Colchester co., N.S., 2 miles from Tatamagouche, on the I.C.R. (Oxford & Pictou branch).

URSA, a post village in Victoria and Haliburton co., Ont., on Bear Lake, 5 miles from Gooderham, on the Irondale, Bancroft & Ottawa Ry. It contains 1 Episcopal church, and 1 shingle mill, with telegraph and express offices at Gooderham Station. Pop. 150.

USHER, a post office in Antigonish co., N.S., 4 miles from Tracadie, on the I.C.R., 19 miles west of Port Mulgrave, on the Strait of Canso.

USONA, a post settlement in Stratheona dist., Alta., 16 miles from Ponoka, on the Calgary & Edmonton branch of the C.P.R., 35 miles north of Red Deer, and 62 miles south of Stratheona (So. Edmonton). It has 1 Lutheran church and 1 schoolhouse. Pop. 25.

UTICA, a post village, in Ontario co., Ont., $\frac{3}{4}$ miles from Manchester, on the Midland division of the G.T.R. It contains 2 churches (Methodist and Presbyterian), 1 hotel, 2 grist mills, 1 saw mill, 1 shingle mill and 1 store. Pop. 100.

UTOPIA, a post village in Simcoe co., Ont., on the Nottawasaga River, and on the Barrie & Meaford division of the G.T.R. It contains 2 churches (Episcopal and Methodist), and 1 flour mill. Pop., 200.

UTOPIA LAKE, a lake of Charlotte co., N.B., near the Bay of Fundy. It is six miles long and abounds in trout.

UTSISSAGOMO (or VOMITTING) LAKE, in Mistassini dist., Quebec, between Lake Mistassini and Ashuapmouchuan, is about 90 miles in circumference, full of islands, and abounds with fish.

UTTERSON, a post village in Muskoka dist., Ont., on Inland River, and a station on the Toronto and North Bay division of the G.T.R., 11 miles south of Huntsville and 135 miles north of Toronto. The chief industries embrace the shipping of tanbark, saw logs, railway ties, pulp wood and hard wood for chemical purposes, also of stock (cattle, sheep, etc.). It has 2 churches (Methodist and Presbyterian), 2 stores, 2 hotels and 2 saw mills, and telegraph and express offices. Pop., about 300.

UTTOKETER, a village in Lambton co., Ont., 6 miles from Wanstead, a station on the Sarنيا & Port Huron division of the G.T.R., $\frac{3}{4}$ miles east of Wyoming. Pop., 50.

UXBRIDGE, an incorporated town in Ontario co., Ont., on a branch of the Back River, and on the Midland division of the G.T.R., 41 miles from Toronto. It has 5 churches (R.C., Episc.,

Meth., Pres. and Free Baptist), 1 Salvation Army barracks, 32 stores, 4 hotels, 2 flour mills and 1 oatmeal mill, 9 factories (piano, carriage, engine and pump, planing, and farm implement), 1 tannery, 2 chartered banks (Dominion and Sterling), 1 private bank, 1 mechanics' institute, several schools, 2 printing and newspaper offices ("Journal" and "Northern Ontario Times"), besides express, telegraph and telephone offices. It has a public park, and is altogether the most important station on the Midland division of the G.T.R. between Toronto and Lindsay. It is also an important grain market. Pop. 1,569.

VACHELL, a post village in York co., Ont., 4 miles from Sutton, a station on the Jackson's Point branch of the G.T.R., 25 miles from Stouffville Jct., and 54 miles north-east of Toronto. It contains Methodist and Presbyterian churches, 1 public school, 1 blacksmith shop and 1 store. Pop. 100.

VAILLANTBOURG, Compton co., Que. See Notre Dame des Bois de Chesham.

VAILLANCOURT, L'Islet co., Que. See St. Pamphile.

VALCARTIER, an incorporated village in Quebec co., Que., on the Jacques Cartier River, 5 miles from Valcartier Station, on the Quebec & Lake St. John Ry., near St. Gabriel. It contains 3 churches (Roman Catholic, Presbyterian and Episcopal), 5 stores and 2 saw mills. Pop. 700.

VALCARTIER STATION, a post settlement in Quebec co., Que., and a station on the Quebec & Lake St. John Ry., 17 miles from Quebec.

VALCOURT, a post village and parish in Shefford co., Que., on the River Noire, 1 mile from Valcourt Station, on the Orford Mountain RR. It has 1 Roman Catholic and 4 Protestant churches, 11 Catholic and 3 Protestant schools, 6 stores, 1 hotel, 1 hour and saw mills, 10 cheese factories, 1 sub agency of the Eastern Townships bank and express office at Station. Pop. of parish, 1,500.

VAL DES BOIS, a settlement in Labelle co., Que., 20 miles from Buckingham. It contains 1 store. Pop. 150.

VALDEZ, an island of British Columbia, in the Gulf of Georgia, lat. 50° N., lon. 125° 2' W., N. W. of Redonda and Cortez Islands. It is the largest of all the islands in the vicinity, and, along with Vancouver, forms the continuation of the gulf, which is also called "Discovery Passage." There is a village upon it, seated on the summit of a steep, sandy cliff about 100 feet in height.

VALDEZ ISLAND, an island in Comox dist., B.C., in the Strait of Georgia, between Vancouver and the district of Nanaimo. It contains 1 Methodist church and 1 store. Pop. 40.

VALENCAY, a post village in Labelle co., Que., on St. Sixte River, 13 miles from Thurso, a station on the Ottawa and Montreal division of the C.P.R., 30 miles from Ottawa, Ont. It has 2 stores and 1 saw mill. Pop. 375.

VALENCIENNES, a post settlement in Megantic co., Que., 10 miles from Plessisville, on the Richmond & Quebec branch of the C.P.R.

VALENS, a post settlement in Wentworth co., Ont., 6 miles from Schaw, on the C.P.R. Pop. 30.

VALENTIA, a post village in Victoria co., Ont., $\frac{7}{8}$ miles from Mariposa, on the Midland
