For rescuing from oblivion the valuable remains of Celtic Literature;

For the establishment and support of Gælic schools in the Highlands of Scotland, and in other parts of the British Empire;

For relieving distressed Highlanders, at a distance from their native homes; and

For the improvement, and general welfare of the Northern parts of the Kingdom, and of the Highland settlements in Canada.

#### CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

1st, The Governor-General of British North America for the time being, to be respectfully requested to become Chief.

2d, The Society to consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, two Secretaries, a Treasurer, eleven Directors, and an indefinite number of Members.

3d, Persons eligible to be admitted Members of the Society, shall be, Highlanders and their descendants; persons who have rendered essential service to Highlanders; Officers of Highland Corps, Regular or Militia; and Husbands of Highland Ladies.

4th, Twelve persons may be elected Honorary Members, without any qualification.

5th, The affairs of the Society shall be managed by a Committee, consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurer, and Directors; three of whom shall form a quorum, for the transaction of business.

6th, All business proposed for the consideration of a General Meeting, shall first be discussed and determined on by the Committee of Management; which shall always meet, previous to any General Meeting; but the proceedings of which must be approved of by the next General Meeting, before they shall be binding or have effect.

7th, All questions before the Committee of Management or General Meetings of the Society, shall be decided by the majority of votes; the President having the casting-vote, except in the case of Election of Members.

8th, That there be Two General Meetings in the Year: one, on the Second Monday in January; and the other, the Anniversary or Festival Meeting, on the Eighteenth of June, if it fall not on a Saturday or Sunday—in which case, it shall be held on the Monday following—to celebrate the glorious Battle of Waterloo.

igs the 10th, That the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurer, and Directors, shall be elected annually at the General Meeting on the Second Monday in January; and that they shall continue in office till the Second Monday in January following inclusive.

11th, The President, one of the Vice-Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurer, with six Members—or, in the absence of the President, the Vice-Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurer, and eight Members, one of whom shall be a Director—shall form a General Meeting.

12th, Persons desirous of becoming Members of the Society, to be proposed at a General Meeting by any Member, and elected by Ballot; three Black Balls excluding the Candidate.

13th, That every Member of the Society shall pay five shillings, with five shillings entrance, or three pounds for his life subscription.

14th, That the interest only of the Life Subscriptions, shall be applicable to the purposes of the Society.

15th, That all Members of the Parent Society shall, on their arrival in Canada, (if they desire it,) be considered Members of this Branch during their residence in Canada, paying the annual subscription of five shillings.

16th, That Branches shall be formed, at the head of which shall be two Vice-Presidents appointed by the Society, with power to elect their own Secretary and Treasurer, in Quebec, Montreal, Kingston, Toronto, Hamilton, and other places; and that one fourth of the funds of these Branches shall be remitted to the Treasurer, at Williamstown, while the remainder is to be disposed of at their own discretion.
